### THE 1969-70 SEASON

The Wolves, reverting to their more familiar gold and black strip, started their season with the flair and skill reminiscen of the 1950s. The first four games were all won with a goal tally of 11 for and 5 against. However, the joy was short-lived as the team then went ten League games without a win although we did succeed in reaching the 4t Round of the League Cup defeating Spurs at home and Brighton away.

It is possible that the reason for our slump was the unexpected departure of Peter Knowles to further the cause of his religious beliefs. This was a great blow to the club especially later in the season

when Derek Dougan was suspended.

The decline in our fortunes was halted at Tottenham where a fine defensive display earned our team two valuable points. This game saw a return to the early season form although they slipped once or twice being beaten at QPR in the League Cup and Crystal Palace in the League.

The months of November and December saw the unfortune absence of Dougan who had been sent off twice and subsequently suspended for eight weeks. As soon as he had returned he was injured in a clash wit

Newton at Goodison Park and he was out for a further seven weeks.

The New Year saw our disappointing F.A. Cup exit at Burnley which was made even more upsetting by winning at Turf Moor in the League the following week. This marked the end of the season so far as Wolves were concenned, a season which had promised so much and produced a little.

The last 13 games were played without a win and the only good game in that period was at The Hawthorns with rivals WBA. Six goals were scored in a cleanly fought game and although the score finished level many thought that the Wolves deserved to win. These games cost us the chance of playing in one of Europe's major competitions this coming season.

What does the future hold for Wolves? The signs are encouraging as they have many fine young players like Bertie Lutton, who reached international status by the end of the season, Paul Walker and Paul Richards who have both shown that they will be assets to the future of the club.

Let us hope that in the coming season, Wolves will achieve the success they so richly deserve.
