Fielding a side bereft of of the players who had started at Manchester City, Wolves looked confident from the start.

Troubled rarely, despite the other WWFC having slightly more of the possession, Wolves gradually stamped their authority on the match.

Having the better of any chances going in the first half, Wolves even won corners in this game, and came close when a Flo header was well saved, and Carl Robinson had a fierce shot just cleared from a goalmouth scramble.

Mike Stowell had little to do, but when called into action mid-way through the half, the referee missed a blatant foul in the air, and the ball ran lose, but he was able to recover and gather the ball.

The second period, saw Wolves in a much more commanding role, and as on Sunday, they found the woodwork again.

Wolves played some watchable football at times, and on the whole, should have ensured a win, which would have maintained the one hundred percent start to the season.

With Pompey keeper Petersen looking particularly vulnerable, a couple of goals from the first half, was not asking too much.

Flo and Simpson had good efforts denied, and Robbie Keane seemed to strike fear into the visitors every time he went near the ball.

It was, however, the visitors who took the lead after thirty six minutes, when the normally reliable Keith Curle, attempting to chest the ball back to Mike Stowell, hardly made contact, and Pompey's record signing, Rory Allen, nipped in to lash a low shot past a helpless Stowell.

Indeed, it could have been even worse but for Neil Emblen, whose timely tackle with Stowell beaten, saved it from being a two goal deficit.

Wolves immediately fought back, but there was to be no reward in this half.

STEVE KEANE TO PROVE A POINT

The first game after the transfer of Robbie Keane to Coventry, left all Wolves fans wondering who would score the goals in a front line that had yet to click.

Despite Ranger's early pressure, one always felt that Wolves held the upper hand, and although the home crowd gave Sinton lots of verbal, the ex Gers man coped well and didn't react, and it was him who supplied the ammunition for Steve Corica to fire Wolves ahead.

On thirty-five minutes, Steve Sedgely picked up a badly mis-cued back pass from Baraclough, and fed Sinton out on the right. Picking out Aussie Corica with a pin point cross, the would be striker charged in on goal, and as it looked as if he had over done it, lobbed the ball deftly over the advancing Miklosko, to give Wolves the lead.

Sinton was in the thick of things again, when feeding Robinson, whose cross was headed over by Peacock. Sedgely also came close, when a fierce header cannoned off two defenders, to spin wide for a corner.

The second half was a familiar pattern, with Wolves defending resolutely, and counter attacking whenever possible.

The ever reliable Keith Curlc however, once again turned into the villain, when with fifteen minutes remaining, the Wolves captain left a seemingly harmless high ball, and Peacock nipped in to crash a shot past the otherwise untroubled Stowell.

- 1. Apologies received from Morris Jacobs, Michael Jacobs, G. Castro, P. Davies, S. Leonard, G. Mastbraker,
- 2. The Chairman welcomed the members, and thanked his committee for all their efforts during the past twelve months.
- 3. The minutes of the 1998 AGM were read, and agreed. Proposed by D. Bracher ,Seconded by G. Blake.
- 4. The Chairman stated that the web site was obviously working, as people had turned up having seen the AGM advertised.
- 5. The Secretary reported membership stood at 287, and that his overall expenses were £746:69.
- 6. The Treasurer's report is published on the opposite page.
- 7. The Travel Secretary reported that trips had been organised to all league and cup matches (home) and to 13 away games. The highest attended attracted 52, and the average weekend attendance was 38.

Profit from trips amounted to £1494, and Peter was looking into the possibility of a subsidised trip next season.

Monies owed for travel amounted to £66, with a further £28 outstanding from previous years.

Eight season tickets had been held by the club, but will be reduced to seven because of loses incurred.

Thanks were proffered to James and Adam at the ticket office, for their help during the year.


- 8. The Social Secretary reported that because of the fixtures, it had not been possible to arrange a major function, but that the "meet the players" evening had been a great success.

- 11. Membership fee unchanged. Proposed G. Castro, seconded D. Bracher.
- 12. New yearly membership scheme to be introduced. New pontoon sellers required.

Kevin Muscat was voted Player of the Year. 39 votes, M. Stowell 12, N. Emblen 11.

There being no more business, the meeting closed at 22.04

FROM LEAGUE NEW BOYS TO GERMAN CUP HOLDERS VIA THE PREMIERSHIP

Dave Slape at the pre-season friendlies

On 20th July, Liverpool came to Molineux and won 2-0 in front of a crowd of 25,000, with Robbie Fowler scoring in the first half, emphasising the overall command that the visitors were in.

Wolves played some attractive stuff, and moved the ball around well, but were unable to supply the two front runners, Harvard Flo, and trialist Ronnie Ekelund with any sort of service.

Wolves upped the tempo from the start of the second period, and an improved performance saw Mark Jones hit the bar, and Carl Robinson have a good effort dis-allowed.

Carl Heinz Reidle extended Liverpool's lead, and Wolves introduced a more youthful look to the team, by introducing Shane Tudor and Joleon Lescott. Lescott looking very impressive.

Saturday 24th saw a hard fought game at Cheltenham, played in extreme heat, in front of 2,000 spectators, and won by a Carl Robinson shot in the first half. As against Liverpool, new signing Andy Sinton played out on the right, with Paul Simpson wide on the right.

Back to Molineux on the 27th, for the visit of German cup holders Werder Bremen, which was negtiated as part of the Harvard Flo deal.

The Germans made life very difficult for Wolves, but once again, second half substitutions saw them improve. Robbie Keane missed out on three opportunities, all with only the keeper to beat, but each time Rost got the better of him.

It was left to new boy Darren Bazeley to head the deserved equaliser, in front of a very disappointing 4,000 crowd.

The final warm up match saw Spurs as visitors on the 31st, and with over 20,000 in their scats, Wolves matched a Tottenham side playing well within themselves. Although Ginola showed some neat touches, Bazeley was not awe struck, and Lee Naylor was back to his best facing Darren Anderton.

Stefan Iversen gave Spurs the lead following a long period of possession, but Wolves equalised through Bazeley, following a neat move involving Keane and Sinton.

Overall, the friendlies were a good workout, although the strikers found difficulties ranging from the league new boys, through the premiership to the German Cup winners, with Bazeley being the pick of the signings, and Naylor, looking to be back to his best.
